- (2) (No longer need 3 copies in City Clerk's Office.)

Items on the Consent Agenda are routine business matters; were previously discussed in a Council Committee and carry a recommendation for approval; or, proposed ordinances approved unanimously by the Council on First Reading. - (f) Emergency Ordinances. An ordinance may be passed as an emergency measure on the day of its introduction if it contains a declaration describing in clear and specific terms the facts and reasons constituting the emergency and receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire Council. An ordinance granting, reviewing or extending a franchise shall not be passed as an emergency ordinance. The emergency procedure shall be restricted to the following:
 - (1) Bills concerning the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health, economic development, safety or morals.
 - (2) An appropriation for payment of principal or interest of the public debt.
 - (3) An appropriation for the payment of current expenses of the City government or payment of compromise settlement of damage claims upon recommendations of the City Attorney.
 - (4) Calling an election or providing for the submission of a proposal to the people.
 - (5) Any ordinance fixing any tax rate or assessment.
 - (6) Any ordinance relating to the public improvement to be paid for by special assessment.

The following proposed ordinances meet the criteria included in Sec. 3.13(f) of the Lee's Summit Charter for Emergency ordinances and are presented for two readings in this meeting. **Six affirmative votes are required for approval of second reading.**
