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E. City Lee's Summit, MO**B. County** 095 Jackson**2X. Further Description**

The storefront area of this building features an angled recessed entry and a plate glass window to the side. There are two storefronts at the first story and the central, wood paneled, historic entrance door is intact. Each storefront consists of two storefront windows and a recessed entry at the right side. Corrugated aluminum siding covers the left storefront transom and the right storefront transom reveals its leaded glass. The cornice displays a decorative, dentil-like Victorian brickwork, which has been painted. Five historic wood frame, one-over-one double-hung windows with splayed brick lintels are at the second story. A brick stringcourse at window level protrudes slightly from the building. Engaged brick pilasters are at the building's edge. (1990)

T. Significance

There have been some alterations (notably the storefront, canopy, and signboard area) which detract from its architectural integrity. However, the building retains much of its historic significance and, as part of the extant portion of the Browning Block, would be a contributing element in a potential historic district. (1990)

No changes have been made to this property since the previous survey. (2001)

History

Constructed soon after the fire of 1885, this was part of a multi-purpose commercial building, the Browning Block (see 228-230 Southwest Main Street). Until the 1900s it served as a barber shop (in 1898, Hulse and DeMoss Barber Shop). By 1909, it was the Charles O. Woods Bakery, and was a bakery at least to the 1920s.

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2Y. Description of Environment and Outbuildings

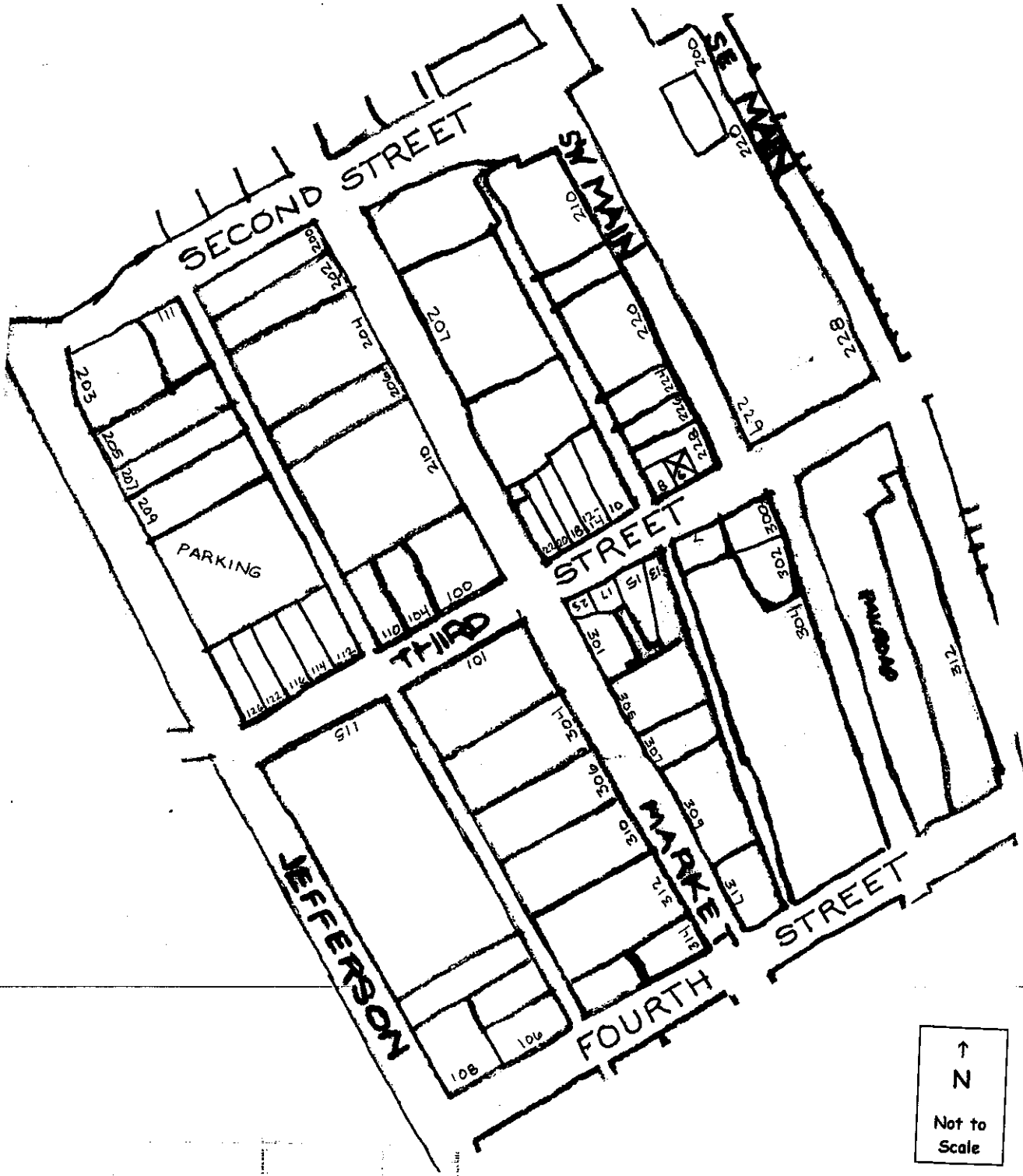
Part of one- and two-part commercial blocks lined with Bradford pear trees. (1990)
