Mr. DJ Good commented on Councilmember Rader and her Mayoral campaign stating she is misrepresenting facts about Lee's Summit.

Ms. Teresa Vollenweider expressed her concerns with the Lee's Summit Police Department not acknowledging where her property line is in comparison to the City's Right of Way.

LSEDC acknowledged they have made policy updates and have new data/software coming that will allow them to better track that information and provide better feedback to stakeholders and the community.

Ms. Donna Lake, Assistant City Manager, spoke on the updated funding request in order to support the Fun Friday activities during the FIFA World Cup.

LSGOAL26 Board Members, Jon Ellis and Laura Maxwell, gave more detail on the events and cost breakdown.

The request is for an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00. Any remaining funds would transfer to the Visitor Bureau's account.

Councilmember Hodges, Councilmember Shields, Councilmember Funk, and Councilmember Rader thanked the LSGOAL26 board and appreciate all the work they have put into events.

Councilmember Prier asked about volunteer sign-ups. The board advised volunteers can go to the LSGOAL26 website to register.

C. [2026-7505](#) Presentation: City of Lee's Summit 2025 Crime Data Trends

Travis Forbes, Chief of Police, presented on the City's crime trends for 2025.

The following statistics were presented:

- Persons Crimes (Violent Crimes) - 2% reduction
- Property Crimes - 17% reduction
- Society Crimes (Drug Crimes) - 14% reduction
- Overall, crime in the City is down by 13.5%

Chief Forbes stated many factors contribute to the flow of crime trends, but believes the Police Department's proactive approach through Mental Health Co-Responders, Safe Passage, education within the schools, and keeping up with technological advances in the Police environment have impacted the current trend.

Councilmember Funk asked if the crime data is able to show how many of the crimes are committed by Lee's Summit residents vs. people not from our city. Chief Forbes did not have that breakdown, but noted it's usually a 50/50 split.

D. [2026-7518](#) Presentation: South Gateway Monument Options

Ryan Elam, Assistant City Manager, gave a brief history on the South Gateway Monument. He advised they are seeking Council's feedback on the final design concept to proceed to construction.

Representatives from Bartlett and West, Lance Johnson and Abby Brown, also presented and showed/discussed the design options.

Council consensus was to proceed with the "replica with the arch" design. It was preferred due to the continuity with the current monuments.
