I am writing as a concerned resident of Raintree Lake regarding the proposed construction of a Christian Brothers Automotive 10-bay garage on SW Market Street. While I support responsible development and understand the need for local businesses, I have significant concerns about the impact this project would have on our community.

First, the scale and nature of the proposed facility are not in keeping with the character of SW Market Street. A 10-bay automotive garage is a large, high-traffic, and potentially noisy operation that would significantly alter the atmosphere of our neighborhood, which is largely residential and small-business oriented. The increased vehicle traffic, noise, and potential environmental concerns, such as oil and

Encouraging developments that align with the existing fabric and long-term vision for SW Market Street is critical to maintaining a vibrant and livable lake community.

I respectfully urge you to reconsider the approval of this project at the proposed location. I also ask that you engage with community members to explore alternative solutions that balance economic development with the preservation of our neighborhood's unique character.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter. I would welcome the opportunity to discuss this further and to hear more about how the Council plans to address the concerns of local residents.

I am writing as a concerned resident of Raintree Lake regarding the proposed construction of a Christian Brothers Automotive 10-bay garage on SW Market Street. While I support responsible development and understand the need for local businesses, I have significant concerns about the impact this project would have on our community.

First, the scale and nature of the proposed facility are not in keeping with the character of SW Market Street. A 10-bay automotive garage is a large, high-traffic, and potentially noisy operation that would significantly alter the atmosphere of our neighborhood, which is largely residential and small-business oriented. The increased vehicle traffic, noise, and potential environmental concerns, such as oil and chemical runoff, could have detrimental effects on the quality of life for nearby residents. There are already 18 other repair bays within 1/4 mile including Walmart, Firestone, and Express Oil.

Additionally, I am concerned about the safety implications. SW Market Street already experiences congestion during peak hours. The addition of a high-turnover business catering to dozens of vehicles daily could exacerbate existing traffic issues, posing risks to pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers alike.

Lastly, I believe there are better-suited locations within the city for this type of business—areas already zoned or accustomed to high-volume commercial and industrial activity. Encouraging developments that align with the existing fabric and long-term vision for SW Market Street is critical to maintaining a vibrant and livable lake community.

I respectfully urge you and your fellow council members to reconsider the approval of this project at the proposed location. I also ask that you engage with community members to explore alternative solutions that balance economic development with the preservation of our neighborhood's unique character.
