

PROCLAMATION



WHEREAS, historic preservation is an effective tool for preserving community history, managing growth, revitalizing neighborhoods, fostering local pride and maintaining community character while enhancing livability; and,

WHEREAS, historic preservation is relevant for communities across the nation, both urban and rural, and for Americans of all ages, all walks of life and all ethnic backgrounds; and,

WHEREAS, it is important to celebrate the role of history in our lives and the contributions made by dedicated individuals in helping to preserve the tangible aspects of our heritage that has shaped us as a people; and,

WHEREAS, “National Preservation Month 2016: This Place Matters” is the nationwide theme for National Historic Preservation Month, 2016, sponsored by the National Trust for Historic Preservation; and,

WHEREAS, in remembrance of Lee’s Summit history and notable historic figures, the Historic Preservation Commission is hosting a Strawberry Lawn Fete on May 1 to honor Longview Farm Elementary, as well as, hosting the 2016 Lee’s Summit Arts and Artifacts Fair on May 14.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Lee’s Summit, Missouri, I hereby proclaim May 2016, as
