Public Hearing: Permit #PRSE20246346 - Appeal of Special Event Permit Denial - You Wanna Pizza Me?, 110 SE 4th Street; Connor Branson, applicant.

City Council discussions included:

- -Proposed location
- -Hours the other pizza places in the area serve food, not bar hours
- -Feedback from other pizza places in the area and if they were notified of this Special Event permit request
- -The length of time special event permits are issued for
- -If there is a way to revoke the permit if complaints are received and if it is appropriate to add wording to the permit now allowing it to be revoked if complaints are received.
- -Clarification of staff's reasons for the recommendation of denial
- -Feedback from the residential residents located next to the proposed area
- -Location of an existing concrete pad in the proposed alley location and if the truck can park on gravel
- -Owner of the property and if the owner, and all renters in the area, approve of this permit
- -This is a trailer, not a truck, so how is it powered and if the generator is gas powered and produces emissions
- -Zoning of houses on other side of Green Street and setting a precedence
- -Clarification of the 100 yard setback requirements and the position of the food trailer on the property
- -Lighting in the area at night
- -If the food trailer will play music and clarification of the existing noise ordinance

5. Public Comments:

6. Presentations:

A. 2025-6778 Presentation and Discussion: Solid Waste Services

City Council discussions included:

- -Clarification of "contract services"; two thirds of communities have some form of contract servicing for trash
- -Clarification of "recycling rates"; refers to participation not the cost
- -Expected amount of savings on road repairs per year
- -Clarification of "debris management"; possible hauling of storm debris
- -Possibility of adding options in the RFP (request for proposal) for cleaning up dump sites on commercial and residential properties
- -Recommend reviewing work done by the previous task force and starting the two year clock to get engagement started
- -New resident expectations
- -Prioritize local over national trash hauling companies
- -Possibility of having zones, pros and cons
- -Percent of residence that don't have an HOA (home owners association) that provides contracted trash service
- -Cost of billing, customer service and contractual oversight
- -Branding of containers
- -Recommend having a Task Force, mail out surveys (not just social media) and asked about having price transparency to share during community engagement
- -Options for filing complaints; the percentage of complaints needed in order for the city to step in
- -If HOA's would be able to keep their existing contracts
- -Eliminating littering by trash trucks; try to write "covered loads" into the contract
- -Possibility of shortening the two year process; state statute
- -Recognition of the reoccurrence of this issue
- -A lot of work has already been done so there is the possibility of starting public engagement sooner than last time
- -If this loses Council support, can the city legislate days of the week for trash pick up
- -Request to include commercial trash pick ups if the days of the week can be

legislated

- -Recent mergers of trash haulers
- -Discussion of having zones in an attempt to help smaller haulers compete with pricing
- -Review of the four points noted in the injunction from the last attempt
- -Request staff presentations for community engagement include known concerns
- -Length of time surrounding cities have had this service
- -Contract based vs Subscription based terminology
- -Commitment from staff to engage the citizens in a truly genuine, sincere, transparent way and address the concerns upfront and City Council will have to trust the next incoming Councilmembers to support this initiative
- -Request staff present a Community Engagement Plan to City Council before sending the 2 year notice
- -Discussion at Council district forums
- -What does success look like; include KPI {Key performance indexes} and inclusion of non-storm debris removal

Mayor's direction to staff: Bring the Community Engagement Plan before City Council at an upcoming meeting and bring a vote to start the two year notice on the same agenda

She asked for City Council consensus to "ask the City Manager to conduct more research on this and request Mayor Pro Tem Lopez to assign this to CEDC (Community Economic Development Committee) to see if there is anything different we can do in this space from a regulatory or enforcement perspective."

There was a consensus of the Mayor and City Council to ask the City Manager to put resources toward researching this topic. Mayor Pro Tem Lopez agreed to assign this topic to CEDC.

12. Staff Roundtable

Mr. Mark Dunning, City Manager, introduced Captain Alex Walker, a newly appointed captain who has been with the city for sixteen years. He then announced the Community Blood Drive will be held March 13, 2025 from 1:00 - 5:00 p.m. at the Harris Park Community Center and added the organization is having a departmental challenge to see which department donates the most blood. Sign ups are available through the website. He also announced on March 20, 2025 from 1:00-6:00 pm at the Gamber Community Center the City will be hosting a Career Fair and Expo.

Mr. Michael Park, Public Works Director, addressed expected weather and traffic conditions over night and in the morning, including planned responses.
