Concerns expressed included the removal of mature trees along the roadway, the necessity of 10-foot-wide sidewalks in the area, and a desire to preserve more of the Speakers possible natural landscape. also raised concerns about the of private properties within the proposed project area. They condemnation indicated that they were speaking not only for themselves, but also on behalf of other area residents who submitted written comments opposing the project.

Mr. Matt Litwork spoke in support of the project, stating that he appreciated the City's efforts to improve the roadway and make necessary stormwater infrastructure enhancements.

Baird responded to the comments, noting that the Mayor Douglas Street improvement project was approved by voters in 2017 as part of an \$11 million infrastructure initiative. 9. Council Comments:

Councilmember Rader addressed the recent liquor license appeal for Galaxy Liquor, which was heard by the Council last week. She expressed interest in exploring an extension of the applicable state statute to increase the required distance from 100 to 1,000 feet between any establishment selling liquor or tobacco and any school. City Attorney Brian Head responded that he was uncertain whether the City has the authority to impose such boundaries but would review the matter and provide further guidance.

Councilmember Shields commented on the concerns raised by downtown residents regarding the Douglas Road project. She reiterated that the project underwent a lengthy public comment period and acknowledged that reopening the process at this stage is not feasible. Michael Park, City Traffic Engineer, provided additional details on the planned improvements, emphasizing their potential to address multiple concerns and offer significant community benefits. He described the project as a reinvestment in Douglas Street and the City as a whole.

Councilmember Shields also announced that safety mirrors will soon be installed in downtown Lee's Summit. She expressed anticipation for their implementation, noting the expected enhancement of both pedestrian and vehicular safety in the area.

10. Staff Roundtable

City Manager Mark Dunning reported that two new boats have been added to the Fire Department's fleet. The boats were recently showcased to both the City Council and the public during the Downtown Days event.

Mr. Dunning also noted that both the "No Kings" event and Downtown Days utilized several resources funded through the previously approved Public Safety Sales Tax.
