





What we heard at the Council retreat



Start the statutory two-year notification process. Determine preference for one or multiple haulers (i.e., quadrants) Determine scope of regulations (residential only or commercial too) Research best practices of communities that have consolidated solid waste collections Determine the impact of current practices in Lee's Summit (litter, pavement conditions, choice, environmental impacts) Success is measured by: Solid Waste Debris management Eliminating dumping of bulky items Resolving unclear direction to staff Reduction of waste - better recycling education Barriers to overcome: Desire for choice Pressure from haulers State regulations/HOA restrictions



LEE'S SUMMIT CITY COUNCIL PROCESS DISCUSSION – HOUSING



What we heard at the council retreat



Housing	 Start with research and benchmarks. Define terms: housing types, ownerships models, affordable vs. attainable vs. luxury. Get a baseline of projects that have been implemented and approved. How many units of what types already exist in what locations? What are the gaps? Identify policy levers and implementation. Move from discussion to action. Zoning – incentives Infrastructure provision – LIHTC projects Land bank Federal funds – programs Community education Land Clearance Redevelopment Authority (LCRA) Other tools?
Housing, cont.	 Review the Comprehensive Plan for balance of housing choices Revitalize older neighborhoods to create interest in attainable housing for first time buyers Public education and developer outreach Success is: More units, attainable units, balance and housing choice, spectrum of housing choices for all stages of life



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Strategic Plan Objectives, **Strategies, and Action Items**



Make regulatory changes to promote a mix of densities and prices.

- · Create more zoning opportunities for different housing choices.
- · Create infill development requirements.
- Review and streamline approval processes.

Incentivize developers to include a portion of affordable housing in residential projects

- Explore the creation of a housing trust to acquire and own property.
- · Structure incentives to move housing to more affordable price points without sacrificing quality.



Evaluate current requirements to allow more housing options.

· Recommend ordinance and code changes in response to data and public input.



Develop a public education campaign about housing needs and goals.

· Engage organizations that are working on affordable housing to lead public outreach and service gaps.

Acknowledge and counter the negative stigma of affordable housing.
