RESOLUTION NO. 06-13

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION FUR THE CITY OF LEE'S SUMMIT, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, the charter is the foundation of home-rule municipal government, addressing the most important aspects of local government and is the organic law of the community; and,

WHEREAS, on April 4, 1995, citizens of Lee's Summit, Missouri, voted to create a Charter Commission to draft a home rule charter for the city; and,

WHEREAS, following extensive meetings, the Charter Commission presented a proposed City Charter to voters, which was approved by the voters and adopted on April 2, 1996; and,

WHEREAS, Section 14.8 of the Charter states that no less often than every ten years, the Council shall provide for a Charter Review Commission to review the Charter and to recommend to the voters proposed amendments, if any, to the Charter; and,

WHEREAS, in compliance with Section 14.8 of the Charter, the City Council determined on May 11, 2006, that the Charter Review Commission was to be comprised of 12 citizens, with each of the eight councilmembers on the City Council nominating one person to serve on the Commission and the remaining four members of the Commission to be nominated by the two councilmembers from each of the four districts; and,

WHEREAS, serving on the Charter Review Commission provides citizens an opportunity to directly participate in shaping the Charter to meet the City's needs in such areas as public services, efficiency of resources, effective local democracy and the aspirations of the city as a whole.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEE'S SUMMIT, MISSOURI, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the City Council for the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, hereby establishes a Charter Review Commission, consisting of twelve members selected by the City Council for the purpose of reviewing the Charter of the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, to determine whether or not the Charter will adequately serve the community into the future and to report to the voters as many amendments to the Charter as the Commission deems advisable.

SECTION 2. That the following persons have been nominated and are hereby selected to serve as the Members of the Charter Review Commission, who shall serve until the Commission has completed its work and has rendered its Report to the Voters, in accordance with City Charter Section 14.8:

SECTION 3. That the City Council for the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, hereby provides for the governance, procedures and staff of the Charter Review Commission, as follows:

- The Charter Review Commission is charged with the duty to review the existing Charter in accordance with Charter Section 14.8 to determine whether or not the Charter will adequately serve the community into the future and to propose such amendments as it shall deem advisable.
- The Commission shall hold the initial meeting on or before Monday, July 31, 2006, and notice of the first meeting will be provided by the City Clerk at a location to be determined by the City Clerk after coordinating with members on time availability.
- The Commission shall, at its first meeting, elect from among its members a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson who shall assume the powers and duties of the Chairperson during the absence or disability of the Chairperson. The Chairperson shall possess the power to vote on all matters before the Commission.
- Members shall meet at least once a month until the task of the commission shall be completed.
- Within twelve months of the first meeting, the Charter Review Commission must report
 to the voters as many amendments to the Charter as deemed advisable. Upon
 completion of the Report, the Commission shall file a copy with the City Clerk.
- Commission members will educate the community about the proposed amendments prior to the election, including the reasons for the recommendations to amend the City Charter.
- The procedures of the Commission shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
- The City Administrator shall be directed to provide the necessary City Staff and resources, as needed by the Commission.

SECTION 4. That the Charter Review Commission shall be discharged of its duties and dissolved upon the date of the election on any proposed amendments.
