Definitions

Sec. 6.1600. - Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms or phrases are defined as follows:

<u>Mobile food vending</u> means the act of selling food and/or beverages by operating a mobile food truck, a mobile food cart, or a mobile packaged food delivery truck.

- 1. Mobile food cart. A non-self-propelled vehicle or stand limited to serving:
 - Non-potentially hazardous foods, as defined by the Jackson County Environmental Health Department,
 - b. Commissary-wrapped food maintained at proper temperatures, or
 - c. Limited to the preparation and serving of hot dogs or similar sausages.
- 2. <u>Mobile food truck.</u> An enclosed vehicle, truck or trailer licensed to operate on public roads in which a person travels from place to place to serve food or beverage.
- 3. <u>Mobile packaged food delivery truck.</u> An enclosed vehicle or truck licensed to operate on public roads in which a person travels from place to place to deliver packaged food that has been previously ordered.
- 4. <u>Single-unit mobile food truck.</u> A Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Class 1-7 vehicle, with vehicle weight less than 33,000 pounds, that is licensed to operate on public roads in which a person travels from place to place to sell packaged food items.



Standards

- Site plan not required if located on private property
 - Traffic circulation
 - Parking impacts
 - Site restoration
- Allowed in any zoning district
- No limit on hours of operation and duration
