Proposed LOS

Stormwater Maintenance

- ❖ Debris Removal/Culvert Cleaning (Reactive)
- Repaired Failed Pipes and Structures
- ❖ Projects funded by General Fund to address immediate life-safety threats from failed infrastructure (e.g. pipe collapse, sink holes, etc.)
 - ❖ Significantly Improved Response Time
- *Cannot keep pace with Address known and emerging needs due to funding and staffing challenges

Stormwater Preventative

- Street Sweeping + Future Enhanced Frequency
- ❖ Permit Compliance (5- Year Recertification)
- Improved Erosion Controls (CIP, ROW, Development)
- ❖ Proactive Inspections and Pipe Rehabilitation
- ❖ Maintenance Program (e.g. similar to pavement)
 - ❖ Basins, BMPs (vacuum cleaning, landscaping, etc.), Litter

Proposed Resources

- PW Maintenance Operators, Contract Specialist shared with other Work Order needs. As Needed
- Dump Trucks, Mini Excavator Rental, Excavator, Skid Steer (with attachments) shared with other Work Order needs. As Needed
- Contracted On-Call Construction for Repairs/Replacements
- Preventative Stormwater CIP Program
- Additional (1) Dump Truck, Mini Excavator,

Stormwater Private Assistance

- Staff consultations. Staff will perform site visits and offer suggestions upon service request.
- ❖ Mail annual notice to HOAs for basin inspections
- ❖Staff Inspections/Reporting of private basins (e.g. HOA)
- ❖ Flood Mapping & Improved Permitting Assistance
- ❖ Flood Hazard & Flood Insurance Program Letters
- ❖ Potentially Limited Private System Acquisitions/Work (Refer to Large Stormwater Projects)

Proposed Resources

- Staff Engineers, Environmental Specialist,
 Neighborhood Services Officers, etc. As Needed
- Environmental Specialist
- Stormwater Public Educator
- Potentially Limited Private System Acquisitions/Work




Resources for Proposed Level of Service

- Add two crews, equipment, public education and support staff
- Adds funding for small capital improvements and maintenance
 - Contracted work for extensive system repairs/replacements
 - Master planning
- Initial Cost \$5.7 Million per year in 2022
- \$6.1 million per year in 2025 adjusted for inflation

Recap: Potential Stormwater Funding Sources

Potential new <u>dedicated</u> stormwater user-charge \$4.7 Million (2025) to \$6.8 Million (2029) Stormwater **User Charge** Potential new **dedicated** Sales (Utility) Taxes: Parks and Stormwater Sales Potential new **dedicated** stormwater tax Tax (1/8 cent): (22.0 cents per \$100 of assessed value) Stormwater \$3.1 Million **Funding** \$6.5 Million Sources General Sales Tax (1/4 cent): \$6.2 Million Sales Taxes **Property Taxes**



Funding Approach Comparison

- Sales Tax
 - + No Billing System
 - + No Collections System
 - + Almost \$0 Administrative Cost
 - + Quicker to Revenue Collections
 - + Earlier Implementation
 - + Fewer Policies
 - + No Exemptions
 - + No Special Oversight Board
 - Less Reliable Revenue Source
 - Reduces Taxing Capacity
 - Indirect Nexus to Stormwater Costs

User Fee

- Requires Billing System (w/Management Costs)
 - Data Management/Updates
 - Address Management/Updates
 - Customer Accounting
 - Potential Business Processes and Staffing
- Requires Collections System (w/Administrative Costs)
 - Annual via Property Tax collections (\$250k overhead)
 - Monthly using utility billing system (\$630k overhead)
- Create Numerous Policies
 - Exemptions; Unpaid bills; Credits; Appeals
 - Composition of oversight board
- Legal work to establish Utility & Utility Board
- Longer Implementation
- + Stronger & Direct Nexus to Stormwater Costs
- + Preserves Taxing Capacity
- + More Reliable Revenue Source



Other Considerations

- Sales Tax
 - 41,649 housing units in LSMO
 - Assume revenue 5% from outside LSMO
 - Assume 10% paid by commercial entities
 - Estimate about \$125 per year per household
 - Easy to collect and administer; systems already in place so no additional overhead

- User Fee
 - Median Home: 4,000 sq. ft Impervious area
 - \$110 per year for median household
 - Increase of decrease based on amount of impervious area
 - \$250,000 to \$630,000 in administrative cost and uncollected revenues

Statutory Authority

Missouri Revised Statutes, Title XL, Section 644.032:

"Sales tax for purpose of storm water control or local parks or both may be imposed by any county or municipality...

Ballot shall contain, but need not be limited to:

Shall the municipality (county) of _____ impose a sales tax of _____ (insert amount) for the purpose of providing funding for _____ (insert either storm water control, or local parks, or storm water control and local parks) for the municipality (county)?





General Sales Tax Funding Option

General Sales Tax (1/4 cent for stormwater)

- Up to 1/2 cent currently available before reaching City's statutory limits
- Will reduce City's future ability to leverage General Sales Tax revenues to ¼-cent
- 1/2-cent CIP Sales Tax due for renewal in 2032 (or earlier).
 Could make permanent and split to fund stormwater and transportation.
- Could "bundle" with Parks & Stormwater 1/8-cent (allow 3/8 for transportation; 1/8 for stormwater)

Parks and Stormwater Sales Tax Funding Option

Parks & Stormwater Sales Tax (1/4 cent for stormwater)

- State statutes allows 1/2 cent for this sales tax
- Currently, 1/4 cent is already used by Parks
- Parks supportive to use remaining ¼ cent for stormwater
- "Rain to Rec" opportunities with dry basins
 - Green space for practice fields
 - Trails
- Regional stormwater management basins
- Most common model across Missouri
