1. Call to Order

The Feb. 9, 2026, Public Works Committee meeting was called to order by Chair Prier at 4:32 p.m. at City Hall, 220 SE Green Street, in the City Council Chambers. Notice had been provided by posting the meeting notice with a tentative agenda, at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting, at both entrances to City Hall and online.

A motion was made by Councilmember Carlyle, seconded by Vice Chair Rader, to approve the agenda as posted. The motion carried by an unanimous 3-0 vote (Councilmember Hodges absent).

5. Business

- A. [2026-7448](#) Approval of the January 12, 2026, Public Works Committee Action Letter

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A motion was made by Vice Chair Rader, seconded by Councilmember Carlyle, to approve the Public Works Action Letter dated Jan. 12, 2026. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

- B. [BILL NO. 26-028](#) An Ordinance approving the award of Bid No. 889 for the Traffic Calming Project on NW Lake Drive to Quality Custom Concepts, Inc. DBA Quality Custom Construction in the amount of \$99,683.00, and authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement for the same. (PWC 2/9/26)

A motion was made by Vice Chair Rader, seconded by Councilmember Carlyle, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

- C. [BILL NO. 26-029](#) An Ordinance approving the award of RFQ 2024-064 and an agreement for professional engineering services for the preliminary design of pump stations to HDR Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$950,770.00, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the same. (PWC 2/9/26)

A motion was made by Councilmember Carlyle, seconded by Vice Chair Rader, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

[BILL NO. 26-030](#) An Ordinance approving the award of RFQ No. 2026-014 and agreement for professional engineering services for the Cedar Creek Interceptor Phase 4 Improvements Project to Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc., in the amount of \$305,753.00, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the same. (PWC 2/9/26)

A motion was made by Vice Chair Rader, seconded by Councilmember Carlyle, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

- E. [BILL NO. 26-031](#) An Ordinance approving Modification No. 3 to an agreement for professional engineering services for the Olive and Orchard Street and Storm Sewer Improvements (Douglas Street to Chipman Road - RFQ No. 2022-060), between the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, and Kimley-Horn, for an increase of \$85,460.00 with an amended amount of \$1,071,893.50 and authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement for the same. (PWC 2/9/26)

A motion was made by Councilmember Carlyle, seconded by Vice Chair Rader, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

- F. [BILL NO. 26-032](#) An Ordinance approving a Transportation Alternatives Program Supplemental Agreement between the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, and the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission related to the public improvement project designated as Federal Project Number TAP-3001(006), Complete Street Improvements: Douglas Street - Chipman Road to 2nd Street, within the city limits of Lee's Summit, Missouri and authorizing the Mayor to execute the same. (PWC 2/9/26)

A motion was made by Vice Chair Rader, seconded by Councilmember Carlyle, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a

unanimous 3-0 vote. (Councilmember Hodges absent).

G. [2026-7443](#) Presentation: FY2027 Capital Improvement Plan Work Session

Mr. George Binger, Deputy Director/City Engineer, presented highlights of changes to the fiscal year 2027 Capital Improvement Plan projects, as an initial conversation and work session. Twenty new projects totaling \$52 million were highlighted, with 30 projects that will be closed out in June. Projects already underway and sequencing, such as two bridge rehabs, need to be re-visited or re-sequenced. Mr. Binger discussed and answered inquiries posed by the Councilmembers such as what drives areas of concern for the sidewalk gap project, and unfunded projects such as interests on Hamblen Road or traffic signals at warranted locations. Staff will then investigate funding sources for those maintenance or concerns.

A public comment form will be available and open on the City website on April 3, then the proposed CIP moves on to Public Works Committee on April 13. Staff is looking into having a year-round comment forum to add to the City website.

This Presentation was received and filed.

6. Roundtable

Michael Park, Director of Public Works, shared general updates from 2025 Public Works projects. Perry Allen, Construction Manager, highlighted calendar year 2025 CIP Project Change Orders with a financial summary of completed projects. There were \$63 million in projects with a 1.19% increase for change orders, with some additional for scope changes. Mr. Park noted appreciation for staff, as well as property owners, commenting that in the last year 0.3% of property acquisitions went to condemnation.
