Purpose of Event	Our fall Troupe program provides area Lee's Summit students, in grades K - 8, the opportunity to enhance their acting, speaking and musical skills in a creative on-stage setting. These students will spend 14 weeks (every Monday night) learning to stretch their creative skills through improvisational acting games, rehearsing scenes from popular musicals and working on their personal performance ability through spoken monologues and musical solos. The Friday, December 16 performance will feature all of our students as they perform with the troupe, and individually, on stage. Our Spring musical production will feature these same students in a full-length, Broadway musical (Show title TBD - currently working with Musical Theatre International - MTI - for securing the performance rights to a production) on Thursday, April 26 and Friday, April 27, 2018. Following four months of rehearsal, these students will go under the bright lights and perform the production to an audience of family and friends. With these two events, Bright Lights Institute seeks to encourage students to cooperate, be creative and cultivate their leadership skills. Bright Lights Institute does not charge admission for its events, allowing area families the ability to attend a live, quality performance of a Broadway musical. Exposing area residents to the arts – and the talents of hard-working students – enhances connections within the city and promotes the arts as a whole.

Purpose of Event	The purpose of Got Talent is to raise funds for the programs of Lee's Summit Cares. Got Talent is a unique competition that celebrates the incredible diversity of talent within our Kansas City area youth. The show encourages young performers (ages 18 and under) to pursue their passion in an affirming and supportive environment. Each year, 20 stage acts perform in front of a live audience. Judges provide feedback and rate performers based on pre-determined criteria. This year, over \$6000 in youth scholarships will be awarded at the end of the night.

	Grant funds will be used to provide a \$500 scholarship award
How will grant funds be allocated to support overall budget	to the winner of the "Crowd Pleaser" award and cover the costs of the text voting component of the award. The performer who receives the highest number of text votes during the competition will receive the \$500 scholarship. Last year's winner, vocal powerhouse Elaine Watson, will be a freshman at Lee's Summit West High School. Lee's Summit CARES is requesting an additional \$500 this year to cover the cost of the text voting. For the past 3 years, Got Talent has been engaging its audience members by asking them to vote for their preferred performer. This is a fun, unique way to invite the audience to participate while awarding an additional scholarship and encouraging performers' ability to "connect" with their audience. An increase in grant funding by the Lee's Summit Arts Council would help us continue to offer this feature during the night of the show. If the Arts Council chooses to award Got Talent with an annual grant, they would be recognized as the exclusive "Crowd Pleaser" sponsor on all Got Talent printed materials. As in years past, a member of the Arts Council is invited on stage at the show to present the award.

Got Talent offers a safe, fun summer activity for school-aged youth within Kansas City. It encourages the pursuit of a higher education for students who might not receive traditional scholarships based on essays, tests or GPAs. It promotes the arts within a community that has been working to grow its local patronage of the arts. Got Talent's judges enhance the show's excellence and reach. Each judge is a graduate of a Lee's Summit high school who has excelled in his or her pursuit of a career in the performing arts. LSHS graduate Matt Lewis is the Executive Producer of SimonWill Entertainment Company, who is best known for his Elvis impersonations. He will be joined by LSHS graduate Lauren Bratton, an accomplished vocalist and actress seen on nearly every stage in Kansas City. Got Talent's third judge is LSNHS graduate, Coleen Dieker, the music director at Temple Congregation B'nai Jehudah in Overland Park. In spring, Got Talent tryouts are held in front of a panel of 3 local judges: Roby Little, Retired Performing Arts teacher, Ben Martin, Director of Summit Theater Group and Ryan Moorehead, Coordinator of MCC – Longview's Cultural Arts Center. Finalists meet with show producers to review their performance, receive judge's feedback and prepare for the event night. Performers participate in a full dress rehearsal the evening before the show. The evening of the show, the 3 event judges provide feedback to performers, then rate the performance based on scale of 1-10 for the following criteria: Level of Ability, Execution of Act, Stage Presence, Costume, Overall Impression/Wow Factor. As judges votes are tallied, the audience is invited to text in their vote for their favorite performance. The artist with the most audience votes wins the \$500 Crowd Pleaser award. Judges scores and producer's feedback will determine the additional winners. This year, 20 acts will compete in front of a live audience in an attempt to win one of four scholarships totaling \$6000.

As March 2018 approaches, we have the opportunity to present the historical drama "The Triangle Factory Fire Project" which commemorates the Triangle Waist Factory fire tragedy on Saturday, March 25, 1911 in New York off downtown Manhattan's Washington Square—where 500 immigrant workers toil fourteen-hour days making lady's dresses—a cigarette is tossed into a bin of fabric scraps. This production uses eyewitness accounts, court transcripts and other archival material to create a dramatic moment-by-moment account of this historic fire and the social upheaval that followed. Closing out our 2017-2018 the groundbreaking contemporary musical "Next to Normal" will expose audiences to a family that in the first moments appears normal. Dad's an architect; Mom rushes to pack lunches and pour cereal; their daughter and son are bright, wise-cracking teens, appearing to be a typical American family. And yet, their lives are anything but normal because the mother has been battling manic depression for 16 years. This project will be a collaboration with ReDiscover to bring more awareness about mental health to our audiences and our community.
