1. We request that the current LS street light upgrade policy that allows for a tax credit equal to the value of a base light be incorporated into any future agreement or possible Public/Private partner with Evergy. My name is Daniel Donovan my wife and I own the building at 1324 SW Market St. Lees Summit Mo. (Santa Fe Glass). I am writing today to see if you would please vote to uphold the Planning Commissions vote to deny the drive thru window at Macdoddles 1499 SW Market St.. When this application was brought to the planning commission it triggered a traffic study that included installing a median on SW Persels and SW Market Street. This would deny further left hand turns for south bound traffic on SW Market St.. Our neighbors and fellow business owners along SW Market are opposed to this median being installed.

I ask that you and your fellow council members please drive this route before the November 1 Council meeting to see the access situation firsthand. Go south on 291 Hwy from 50 Hwy, turn right on SW Persels rd.. If the median is installed you would then turn south on Jefferson to try and gain access to this industrial park. This gives you no access to the post office. If the median is NOT installed you would turn left on SW market to gain easy access to our neighborhood and post office.

Concerns if median is installed.

- 1. People would slow when trying to access post office causing possible rear end collisions.
- 2. People would look to U-turn in Abundant life parking lot after passing median with kids and school buses present.
- 3. Slow response times of emergency vehicles entering the industrial park.
- 4. The Phillip 66 station on the corner of SW Persels and SW Market street would be severally impacted and may be forced to close down. This could lead to blight in the neighborhood.
- 5. All current business and property owners have made substantial capital investments in their business and buildings to serve the Lees Summit area. It does not seem right for a business to rent

A location and add a drive thru window and be allowed to upheave our access and the community access to our locations and the post office. This was not well thought out.

Please vote to uphold the Planning Commission's decision to deny the 2022-5188 Macdoddles drive thru application.
