Arts Council, Historic Preservation Commission and Beautification Commission combine into new Cultural Commission.



*Cultural Commission will serve as the Historic Preservation Commission. (Statutory requirement.)

Cultural Commission Purpose Statement

The Cultural Commission elevates the public realm by advising the City Council on recommendations regarding arts and cultural programming, community aesthetics, and historic preservation issues relevant to citizens and visitors.

Key Functions Summary

- To advise on and support the implementation of artistic, cultural, and historic initiatives coordinated through the relevant City departments, commissions or entities.
- Work with other departments and entities to encourage the incorporation of artistic, cultural, historic, tourism and beautification efforts into the City's overall design, function and economic development when possible.
- Make recommendations to City Council and Administration on ways to increase public awareness of our cultural and historical resources that make our City unique.
- Serve as the City's Historic Preservation Commission for the purpose of maintaining the City's status as a Certified Local Government with the State Historic Preservation Office.
- Advise on public art initiatives and policies (collections, monuments, gateways, etc.).

Membership

- Nine (9) but no more than fifteen (15) members.
- Three (3) year terms commencing from the date of appointment.
- Members should demonstrate understanding of history, humanities, fine art, performing art, public art, natural resources, or cultural resources.
- At least five members shall have a demonstrated interest, competence, or knowledge in historic preservation. (Historic Preservation Commission continuation).
