Mayor Rhoads closed the Regular Session at 7:05 and opened the public hearing. Those wishing to give testimony during this public hearing were sworn in by the City Clerk.

Mr. William Neds with HDR, 3741 NE Troon Drive, represented the applicant. This request was to rezone approximately nine acres located east of SW Raintree Parkway from a CP-2 zoning to R-1 residential. The property owners wish to build a single-family home on the lot.

Mr. Hector Soto, Planning Division Manager, entered Exhibits 1-19 into the record. He stated this request was in compliance with the 2005 Comprehensive Plan and compatible with recent a zoning to the north for the Raintree subdivision. An easement will be required for a drive, since the property is landlocked. Staff recommended approval with one condition.

Hearing no further testimony, Mayor Rhoads closed the public hearing at 7:10 p.m. and reconvened the regular session.

	Mr. Rich Wood with Gilmore and Bell reviewed the history of this TIF (Tax Increment Financing) project. This amendment was to revise the budget to reduce the cost by removing a \$5-million line item for construction of the Strother Interchange TDD. The cost will be reduced from \$8,072,000 to \$4,101,764. A hearing was held by the TIF Commission on April 4th and they unanimously recommended approval.

Mr. Bill Moore, attorney for the applicant, and Mr. Jay Burchfield, developer, provided presentations.
