2. <u>BILL NO.</u> 18-95

An ordinance authorizing execution of Modification No. 3 to On-Call Agreement for Environmental Professional Engineering Services Yearly Contract with Stearns, Conrad and Schmidt, Consulting Engineers, Inc. DBA SCS Engineers (Original RFQ No. 2017-307, Renewal 2017-307/R1) for annual tasks associated with the Resource Recovery Park for a not to exceed cost of \$76,200.00, and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for the same. An ordinance authorizing execution of a Contract in accordance with the City's On-Call Contract for Repair Services for Water, Wastewater, and Stormwater Infrastructure (Contract 2013-128/4R) with Wiedenmann, Inc. for installation of a leachate cut-off trench at the City's Resource Recovery Park for a not to exceed cost of \$63,681.00, and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for the same. An ordinance authorizing an amendment to permit the extension of the project time period from December 31, 2017 to December 31, 2018 of the State Block Agreement by and between the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, and the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission, Granting State funds in the amount of \$9,372,772.00 for rehabilitate and strengthen Runway 18-36, Extend Runway 18-36, Extend Runway 11-29; and Runway 18-36 and 11-29 lighting improvements. (BOAC 6-11-18) (PWC 6-19-18)

An ordinance approving change order #3 to the contract with Miles Excavation, Inc. for the Highway 50 Watermain, Blackwell to Harris project, an increase of \$39,549.93 for a revised contract price of \$687,556.17. (PWC 6-19-18)

(PWC 6-19-18)

An ordinance authorizing execution of an agreement with Wilson & Company, Inc., Project No. 73-3221 (original RFQ No. 11001-D), in an amount not to exceed \$380,840.00 for Professional Engineering Services for the Chipman Road Improvements from View High Drive to Bent Tree Drive. (PWC 6-19-18)

An ordinance authorizing the execution of Modification No. 1 to agreement dated February 5, 2017 (RFQ NO. 2017-305A) for professional Engineering Services for Gateway Drive improvements by and between the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri, and Garver, LLC, for a net increase of \$7,822.00 with a revised contract amount not to exceed \$128,224.00. (PWC 6-19-18)

Items for Discussion

9. 2018-2112 Discussion on Transfer Station construction at the Resource Recovery Park. (PWC 6-19-18)

A motion was made by Councilmember Binney, seconded by Councilmember Forte, to recommend to City Council to direct the City Manager to pursue Option #2, to allow Summit Waste Systems' proposed design change knowing there may be a funding shortfall at opening of bids.

Roundtable

Vice Chair DeMoro brought up the storm from three weeks ago. He commended Public Works personnel who took time out of their busy weekend clearing the streets and sidewalks to make the city move again. He expressed frustration that there weren't more groups able to help citizens with tree removal after the storms.

Councilmember Binney echoed comments about storm cleanup but saw positive things including a Public Works employee helping a neighbor after hours and other neighbors helping each other. He then asked for a CIP projects update; the monthly status report was mentioned and will be emailed out to the Committee.

Chairman Faith mentioned that his thoughts and prayers are with the families of Wyandotte County Deputees King and Rohrer. He described the flag codes and why the city was not able to lower flags to half staff and said they are looking into and discussing what to do in the future to be able to lower flags. He asked about the ASOS system at the airport and if the problem was resolved; Mr. Bob Hartnett replied that Airport manager John Ohrazda is working with AT&T to re-establish service. He also announced the Airport Open House this Saturday from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. The address is 402 Leinweber Rd.

Water main breaks occurred last Friday night at John Knox Village and at Miller and 8th streets. He thanked supervisor Matt Wansing and his team for doing an outstanding job.

Assistant City Manager Christal Weber reminded residents that they can find information on being prepared for storms and other emergencies at Ready.gov. She also stated that the recent water main breaks were due primarily to heat and excessive draw on the system. Water Utilities is keeping a large number of crews on call to respond to the breaks.
