 - Increased accountability








Expand Crime Reduction Team


- Not 9-1-1 response oriented as primary priority




Currently assigned to Special Operations Captain, who supervises Traffic Unit


Captain would supervise Evening Shift Patrol & CRT

 - Provides services needed



- Benefits of police presence




















Substation Services

- Shared City services officing








Police Presence

 - 2 Police Services Officers (walk-in services)








Improve Mental Health Services

- Mental health/addiction calls for service
- Police approach
- CIT program
- Mental health co-responder







Mental Health Co-Responder

- Mental health clinician embeds with police
- Immediate, on-scene intervention
- Avoid arrest, unnecessary ER visits
- Reduces police calls
- Johnson Co, KS Mental Health Co-Responders
 - Pilot in 2011 of one MHCR
 - Eleven MHCRs today
 - 9,193 responses in 2017



 - Digital evidence processing








Improve Investigative Response

- Fulfilling this priority:
 - Four (4) officers (detectives)-CIU
 - One officer (detective) SIU
 - One sergeant
 - One part time property tech
 - Camera system
 - One mobile, two fixed LPRS
 - Digital evidence hardware







- Critical incidents
 - Weather-related
 - Crime scenes
 - Hostage/barricades
 - Active shooters







- Mid-sized command post
 - Quickly deployable
 - Critical Incidents
 - Community events
 - Special events








- Current staffing: two
 - Night shift hours
 - No day shift coverage
- Supervision








- Fulfilling this priority:

- Restructuring
 - Elimination of Major for Deputy
 Chief position (2019)
 - Eliminated Support Division
 - Budget limitations








- Administrative Assistant
 - Currently part-time
 - Need for grant research/application/administration
 - Management Analyst III
 - Budget neutral








- Police Training
 - 24 hours per year
 - 147 officer
 - 3,528 hours required for LSPD (not including civilian staff or new recruits)
 - Training above and beyond
 - Supervision







- Fulfilling this priority:
 - One Major (Support Division)
 - One Sergeant (Training)
 - One Management Analyst III (Grants/Administration)







Improve Traffic Safety

- Traffic Unit
 - Staffing since 1998
 - Doubled population
 - 90% increase in roadway miles
 - Increase in crashes
 - Increase in special events








Improve Traffic Safety

 - Two Officers (Traffic)








Animal Control Needs

 - Growing demands with population








Animal Control Needs
