As president of the Newberry Homeowners Association, I have spoken with many members of Newberry Homes regarding the addition of the middle school. The largest concern will be the increased traffic within Newberry on Cape Drive and SE 13th Street due to individuals wishing to bypass the Bailey Road entrance and doing so at unsafe speeds. There is already an issue within Newberry on Newberry, Cape, SE 13th Street, and Bailey Road with individuals exceeding the speed limit while also driving distracted (cell phones). Since Newberry will likely be a walkzone for the middle school, the Newberry Community would like the city to keep in mind the children who will be walking to school when planning and approving sidewalk and road plans.
