#### (2.3) Detailed Justification of the Need:

Truman Habitat will continue to deliver a service already identified, and previously provided, by the City in response to a priority need for owneroccupied home repair for existing LMI homeowners. Habitat offers the city the benefit of our expertise and the value of the HFH model using the same CDBG funding source and amount used for many years. Utilizing Truman Habitat for Humanity as a sub recipient provides additional support to the program by utilizing gift-in-kind product and supplies; volunteer support; construction management expertise and donations restricted to the Home Preservation Program to be combined with CDBG funds and stretched to serve more than 10 families typically supported in the past.

According to the City of Lee's Summit's Consolidated Plan (DRAF) 2020-2024, When considering only housing costs and household income levels, a total 29% of the households in Lee's Summit are low to moderate income, according to the 2011-15 CHAS data presented in Table 6. Approximately 60% of all households with a t least one person age 75 or older are low to moderate income households. These households bear the greatest housing cost burdens.

Additionally, on page 30 of the proposed Consolidated plan it states that the characteristics that have been linked with instability and an increased risk of homelessness is the older housing units occupied by low-to-moderate income households have more needs for home repairs to ensure safe and decent living conditions. Without assistance, these homes may potentially become uninhabitable and unsafe to occupy.
