CIP "Defined"

- Planning document for major public infrastructure
- Anticipated improvements over next 5 years "list of projects"
- Updated annually
- Financial/budget component financially constrained
- Costs included in 1st year of plan become fiscal year capital budget
- Adopted by Planning Commission as part of the Comprehensive Plan and to meet statutory requirements for public hearings for location, extent and nature of projects
- Adopted by City Council resolution in accordance with City Charter

- Council Presentation May 18
- Planning Commission Public Hearing May 20
- Council Resolution June 1
- FY22 funds available July 1
