Park Impact Fee Proposal Ordinance	Supporting documentation (see pages 31-48). Mr. Casey presented the Park Impact Fee Proposed Ordinance and if approved would go forward to City Council with a proposal effective date of July 1, 2024. The fee is all metric driven based on staff's research. Credit and fee waivers were also discussed. Five established service areas were identified.
