A. 2023-5701 Approval of the May 8, 2023, Public Works Committee Action Letter

 B. <u>BILL NO.</u> An Ordinance approving Modification No. 4, to the agreement with Crawford, <u>23-131</u> Murphy and Tilly, Inc. for On-Call Professional Planning & Engineering Services for the airport (RFQ No. 2020-067) in the amount of \$39,200.00, and authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement for the same. A motion was made by Councilmember Prier, seconded by Vice Chair Edson, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous 3-0 vote (Councilmember Lovell absent).

I. <u>2023-5658</u> A Resolution supporting the Regional Climate Action Plan.

Michael Park, Director of Public Works, presented a resolution of support for the City to adopt a Regional Climate Action Plan. Mr. Park noted a Climate Action Plan is required for eligibility for some federal funds, and the City is not obligated to follow all of the recommendations in the plan. Mr. Park introduced Tom Jacobs, from Mid-America Regional Council, who presented the Regional Climate Action Plan. Discussion took place. Committee members expressed concerns over some of the items in the plan.

The Public Works Committee directed staff to draft an alternative City plan, or alternative in reference to the Regional Climate Action Plan with exceptions, for consideration. Mr. Park noted staff will have four months to pull a plan together in order to meet applicable federal funding project application deadlines. The Public Works Committee agreed.

This Resolution was received and filed.

J. <u>2023-5686</u> Discussion - Private Utility Relocations with Capital Roadway Improvement Projects

> Michael Park, Director of Public Works, presented a question and answer dialogue about undergrounding utilities. City staff is seeking input from Councilmembers to understand what the committee is looking for in relation to Capital roadway improvement projects. Discussions took place. Councilmember Prier stated she feels the downtown corridors and all major roadways are areas where it is important to have utilities buried.

Mr. Park summarized by stating staff can do more research in the area of hypothetical costs for the City, legal constraints, and alternatives. The matter

was tabled until a later date.

This Discussion Item was received and filed.

6. Roundtable

Councilmember Prier inquired if there is a landscaping ordinance for new businesses in the City. Ryan Elam, Assistant City Manger, answered that the City does have a landscaping ordinance under the Unified Development Ordinance. This is more of a discussion for Community and Economic Development Committee (CEDC) and this is on the list for that committee to review.

Mr. Park gave an update on the stormwater utility advisory committee meetings. The next step is a full presentation to City Council on June 20. A second update was given on the Little Blue River Watershed study. City staff met with the Corps of Engineers to review flood risk mitigation strategies and ecological restoration measures. The group is seeking an additional five months for more in-depth analysis. Otherwise, without the additional five months, a draft report is scheduled for April 2024.

Mr. Park announced the Browning Street project is completed. Contractor Amino Brothers is hosting an open house and celebration at noon on Friday, June 16.
