Discussion of Collaborative Methods between City Council and Planning Commission

Issue/Request:

Discussion Outline:

Trust the Process

- Protect our citizens via ordinances
 - Master Planning
 - Safety

- Less variances is best
 - The more variances the more community support needed otherwise we need to use caution
- Work toward solutions
 - Always bat the ball back in their court. You can't do this, but you could do something like this.
- Greater communication
 - Citizens
 - Planning commission
 - City council
- Get citizens involved earlier when there is potential conflict.
 - Keep the decorum
 - Coach citizens to use the proper language and make reasonable objection
- Retraining
